RECIPE FOR CORNISH SPLITS

1lb FLOUR
1oz YEAST
2oz LARD OR MARGARINE
1teaspoon of SALT
1 teaspoon of SUGAR
1/2 pint of WARM MILK

Pre-heat oven to 400° F (200° C) gas mark 6

Mix the yeast and sugar to a liquid, add some warm milk and put to sponge.

Sieve the flour into a mixing bowl and rub in the salt and fat.

Add the yeast mixture and the rest of the milk, knead well together and put to prove in a warm place until double in size.

Knead again and make into rolls or buns, place on a floured tray and allow to prove again, then bake for 15 minutes.

RECIPE FOR LEMON DRIZZLE CAKE

4 oz/125g SOFT MARGARINE
6 oz/175g SR FLOUR
1 level tsp BAKING POWDER
6oz/175g CASTER SUGAR
2 EGGS
4 tblsp MILK
GRATED RIND OF 1 LEMON

TOPPING

JUICE OF 1 LEMON
4oz/125g CASTER SUGAR

Put all ingredients into a bowl and beat

Put in a 2lb loaf tin with non-stick liner.

Bake at 350F /180 C approx. For 40-50 minutes approx

(Reduce for fan assisted oven)

While still warm add sugar to lemon, fork criss cross pattern on top of cake and slowly pour juice over.

3. All exhibits to be grown or produced by the exhibitor (excepting floral art classes) The committee reserve the right of inspection.
4. Exhibits in 72 to 94 inclusive must not have been shown at previous St Teath Village Shows.
5. No entry fees and no cash prizes.
6. Exhibits must be staged between 6pm and 8pm on Friday, or between 8am and 10am on Saturday morning. The halls will be cleared by 10am sharp of all persons not officiating during judging. The show will open to the public at 2pm. All exhibits to be removed between 5-6pm.
7. A maximum of two entries per class per exhibitor.
8. Points awarded in each class. 1st = 4 points, 2nd = 2 points, 3rd = 1 point. Only one award per class counts for Points Cups.
9. The judge's decision will be final.
10. In all other matters the decision of the committee shall be final.
11. Vases etc. to be provided by the exhibitor.
12. The committee, whilst taking all possible care, accept no liability for any loss or damage to the exhibits or property, or personal injury in any form.
13. All trophies are perpetual, to be held for one year only and returned to the secretary by the closing date for entries.
