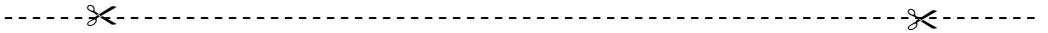

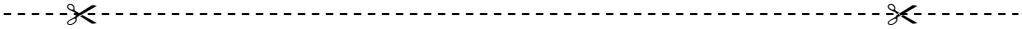

RECIPE FOR SCONES

8ozs SELF-RAISING FLOUR

2ozs BUTTER (softened)

1oz CASTOR SUGAR

1 EGG

MILK

Pinch of SALT

Pre-heat oven to 425° F (220° C) gas mark 7

Greased baking sheet

Sift the flour and salt into a bowl

Add the butter and rub in with the finger tips until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs

Stir in the sugar

Crack the egg into a measuring bowl and lightly beat, then make up to a 1/4 pint with milk

Stir into the flour and mix to a soft dough

Turn onto a lightly floured table, knead gently and roll out to 1/2 in thick

Cut into rounds with a **2 ½ IN. FLUTED CUTTER**

Place on the baking sheet and bake for 10 minutes or until pale golden brown

Cool on wire rack

RULES FOR ENTRY

1. Entries are restricted to persons in the St Teath Electoral Roll area. Members of the St Teath Women's Institute and/or Gardening Club, and pupils of St Teath School and Playgroup.
2. Entries in writing to the show secretaries before 12 noon on Wednesday 19th. August 2009.

3. All exhibits to be grown or produced by the exhibitor (excepting floral art classes) The committee reserve the right of inspection.
4. Exhibits in 73 to 94 inclusive must not have been shown at previous St Teath Village Shows.
5. No entry fees and no cash prizes.
6. Exhibits must be staged between 6pm and 9pm on Friday, or between 8am and 10am on Saturday morning. The halls will be cleared by 10am sharp of all persons not officiating during judging. The show will open to the public at 2pm. All exhibits to be removed between 5-6pm.
7. A maximum of two entries per class per exhibitor.
8. Points awarded in each class. 1st = 4 points, 2nd = 2 points, 3rd = 1 point. Only one award per class counts for Points Cups.
9. The judge's decision will be final.
10. In all other matters the decision of the committee shall be final.
11. Vases etc. to be provided by the exhibitor.
12. The committee, whilst taking all possible care, accept no liability for any loss or damage to the exhibits or property, or personal injury in any form.
13. All trophies are perpetual, to be held for one year only and returned to the secretary by the closing date for entries.
